What am I currently doing or can I start doing to use green power purchasing, bio-fuels, energy efficient equipment, and light bulbs?

What am I currently using or can I start doing to use biodegradable, non-toxic, no/low volatility materials in my business?

What am I currently doing or can I start doing to conserve and re-use water and to use non-toxic cleaning supplies and methods?
